EAST ANGLIAN TRADITIONAL MUSIC TRUST Vaughan Williams' Folk John Barleycorn

This version of John Barley corn was collected by Vaughan Williams from singer Llewelyn Mallion in the village of Fen Ditton, Cambridgeshire on 22nd August 1906, one of 3 songs he sang on that day.

In the 1901 census Llewelyn was 52 years old and lived at 13 Green End in the village, next door to a pub called "The Harvest Home". At the time he was a labourer in the nearby cement works but had a variety of jobs throughout his life. In 1911 he was employed as a Labourer and by 1921, aged 73, was still working, as a farm labourer at Swage Farm in Milton, whilst living in the High St at Fen Ditton. He lived until the old age of 87, dying in 1936.

The map shows the location of Fen Ditton as it lies in the North East corner of Cambridge today.
